World Youth Championships (WYC) Application

The WTBA Executive Board determines the awarding of a WTBA championship to a host. The information provided in this Championship Application will be considered by the Executive Board in choosing a host. Additionally, a physical inspection of the facilities may be performed at WTBA's discretion. The Application is divided into 12 parts:

1. Basic information
2. Entry fees paid to the host
3. Commitments and guarantees
4. Organization profile
5. Pre-championship activities
6. Administration
7. Transportation
8. Hotel(s)
9. The bowling center
10. Championship activities
11. Ceremonies
12. Post championship activities

1. Basic Information

1.1 Championship information

The following must be presented: A. city and the country where the championship will be held; B. name of the bowling center; and C. proposed dates for the championships. Depending on the size of the bowling center, the WYC will have between 9 and 11 days of actual competition, plus date of departure.

1.2 Federation information

Please advise as to the nature of involvement, if any, of your national and/or regional bowling federations. If they have some level of involvement, please provide the name of the federation, the postal address, the phone number, the fax number and the email address.

1.3 Host contact persons – two persons are requested

Please provide contact information for two host representatives, including, name, postal address, phone number, mobile phone number, fax number and email address.

2. Entry fees paid to the host

2.1 WTBA shall pay to the host \$100USD for each members of the official delegation (athletes, coaches and team officials), and each registered guest/supporter.

2.2 Media representatives are exempt from paying an entry fee, unless they are also acting as a team official.

3. Host commitments

The applicant must verify that the following will be provided for the official delegation members, registered guest/supporter and WTBA officials: A. Airport pick-up and return; B. Transportation between designated hotels and the bowling center in accordance with a pre-arranged schedule; C. Bowling expenses for all official practice and competition; D. Opening Ceremony; and E. Closing Ceremony



The applicant must also provide the following: A. medical personnel on call; B. registration process and badges of accreditation; C. security measures for bowling equipment storage; D. results services: media facilities, including a room with tables and chairs large enough for 30 people, with adequate electronic access to the internet; E. meeting room for Team Managers' meeting before the start of the WYC (50-80 people); and F. a championships website.

4. Organization profile

Please describe the identity and nature of the proposed host organization.

5. Pre-championship activities

5.1 WYC promotion

Describe how the WYC promotion activities will be performed. Include facts such as, but not limited to media contacts, local government involvement, community involvement activities, web site information, sponsor contacts,

5.2 Information package

Describe how any information package given to the federations upon arrival will be distributed.

5.3 The registration procedure

6. Administration

6.1 The WYC office

A WYC office must be available for use by the WTBA President, Tournament Director and Technical Delegate.

8. Hotel(s)

8.1. Basic hotel information

The following information must be provided for each available hotel: name of the hotel, address, phone number, fax number, email address and website address.



8.2. Hotel rooms and rates

The following information must be provided for each available hotel: A. number of single rooms, double rooms, triple rooms and quad rooms available, and the rate for each room category including breakfast and all taxes.

8.3 Other hotel characteristics

The following information must be provided for each available hotel: A. distance to the airport; B. distance to the center; C. standard of the rooms; D. availability of restaurants at the hotel (size, opening hours, etc.); E. meeting facilities; F. hotel security; G. ADSL lines available (free or by a fee as defined at the hotel); H. availability of restaurants in the vicinity; I. availability of shops at the hotel; and J. availability of shops in walking distance or by public transportation.

8.4 Hotel reservation forms

Describe how the hotel reservation forms will be prepared, circulated and handled.

8.5 Confirmation of hotel reservations

Describe how the confirmation of hotel reservations will be handled.

8.6 Check in and check out procedures

Describe how the check in and check out procedures will be prepared.

8.7 Payment of the participating federations' hotel costs

Describe how the payment of the participating federations' hotel costs will be specified and handled.

9. The bowling center

9.1. Basic bowling center information

The following information must be provided: the name of the center, address, phone number, fax number, email address and website address.



9.2. Technical information

The following information must be provided: A. number of lanes; B. brand and type of the lane approaches; C. brand and type of the lane surface; D. brand and type of the pin decks; E. brand and type of the pin setters; F. brand and type of the pins to be used during the WSC; G. brand and type of the scoring system; and H. last date of resurface (if wood lanes).

The minimum number of lanes for WYC is 24 lanes.

9.3 The environment

Describe how the environment (temperature, humidity) is controlled.

9.4 Pinsetters and ball returns

Describe how the proper functioning of pinsetters and ball returns will be guaranteed. Include facts about, but not limited to failure risk analysis, availability of spare parts, number of mechanics and their experience, and communication system between control counter and machine room.

9.5 Bowling pins.

Describe how the uniformity and condition of the bowling pins will be guaranteed.

9.6 Players' area

Describe how the players' area will be arranged. Include facts about, but not limited to size, marking out place for balls in addition to the ball returns.

9.7 Scoring system

Describe the functioning of the scoring system. Include facts about, but not limited to A. failure risk analysis; B. testing of championship event formats and lane movements; C. capacity of the scoring system to export results in text or other files; D. skill of operating personnel; and E. procedure in case of breakdown.

9.8 Medical personnel

Describe how the medical personnel will be available.



9.9 Spectators' area

Describe how the spectators' area will be arranged. Include facts about, but not limited to the capacity of the spectators' area.

9.10 Press Room

Describe how the Press/Media Room will be arranged. Include facts about, but not limited to: A. location; B. capacity (number of press representatives); C. equipment (tables, chairs, stationary pc's internet connections and their capacity); D. Access restrictions; E. Interview area; and F. availability of internet, copy capability and fax access.

9.11 Food and refreshments

Describe how food and refreshments will be available (for the teams, press and VIPs).

9.12 Security

Describe how the security will be enforced (procedures and personnel).

9.13 Doping control facilities

Describe how the doping control facilities will be arranged (may be current rest room facilities).

10. Championship activities

10.1 Bowling balls inspection

Describe how the inspection of bowling balls will be performed. Include facts such as, but not limited to location, number of scales, number of inspectors, experience of inspectors, and availability of random inspection during competition

10.2 Equipment store

Describe how the bowling balls and other equipment will be stored. Include facts such as, but not limited to location, size, temperature control, marking out of space for each federation.



10.3 Players check in at squads

Describe how the players will be checked in prior to the start of each squad.

10.4 Start of the competition and lane changes

Describe how the start of the competition and the changing of lanes will be announced.

10.5 Playing rules

Describe how the observance of the official playing rules will be controlled. Include facts such as, but not limited to number of referees, training of referees.

10.6 Presentation of scores and standings

Describe how the scores of each game will be collected, processed, and published in the bowling center, to the media representatives, and on the championship website.

11. Ceremonies

11.1 Opening Ceremony

Describe how the Opening Ceremony will be organized. Include facts about, but not limited to location, duration, seating arrangements for VIPs, and speakers.

11.2 Medal ceremonies

Describe how the medal ceremonies will be organized, including presentation of flags (which are provided by federations).

11.3 Closing Ceremony

Describe how the Closing Ceremony will be organized. Include facts about, but not limited to location, duration, seating arrangements for VIPs, speakers, and food/beverage availability.
